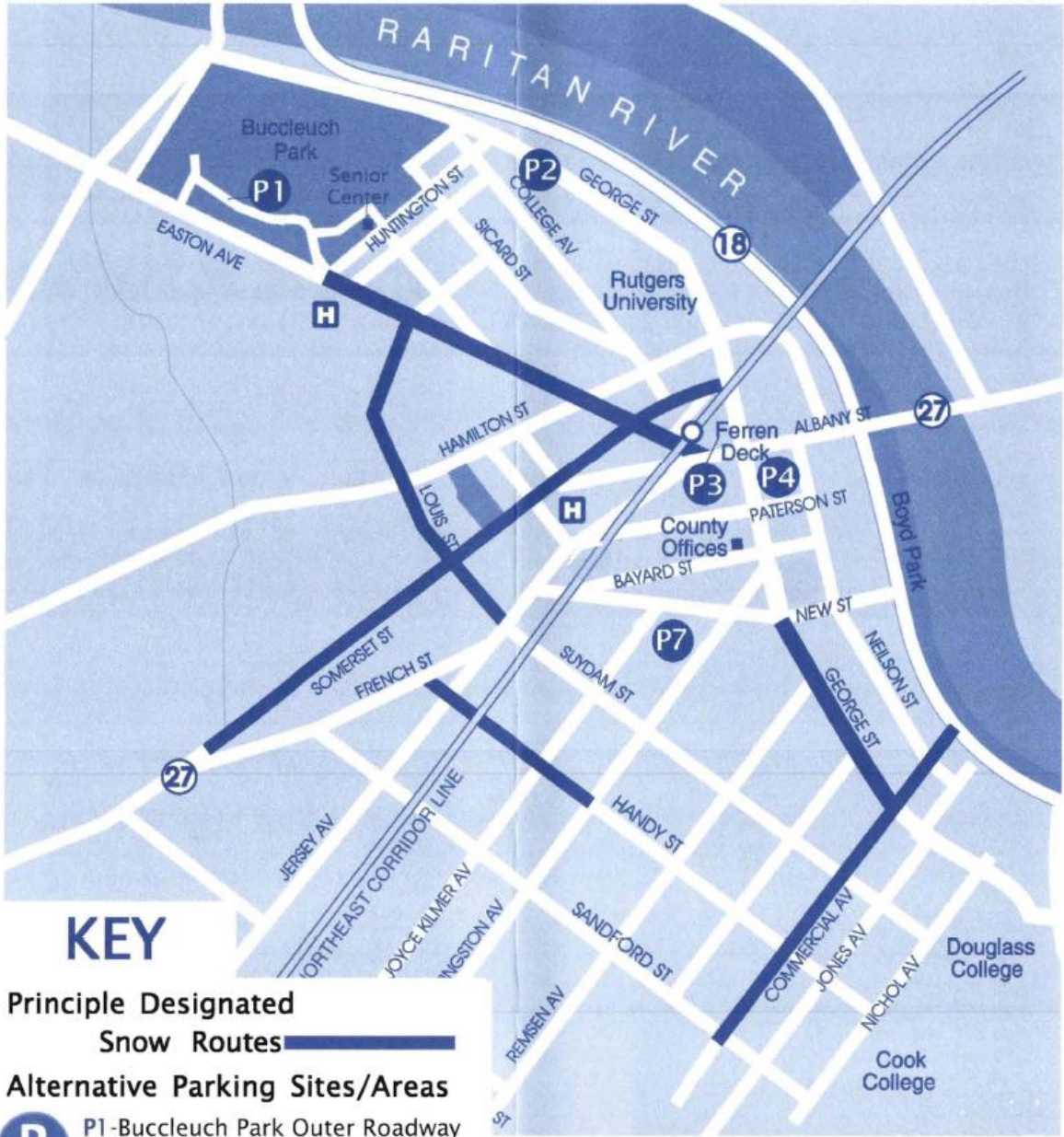

**P** P2-Rutgers University, College Avenue Deck - Monday thru Friday 8pm-8am only and anytime weekends.

**P** P3-Ferren Deck, P4-Lower Church Street Deck, P7-New Street Deck - Cars must be removed during normal operating hours, unless a Snow Emergency is still in effect.

# THE BASICS – PARKING & SNOW

*Parked cars on Designated Snow Routes prevent accurate and complete snow plowing. There is a vital need for Designated Snow Routes to be plowed from curb to curb as reduced travel lane widths can lead to accidents, inaccessibility for fire and rescue vehicles and constricted traffic flow. We realize it may be an inconvenience to move your car, but for the safety and benefit of all New Brunswick residents, businesses and institutions, it must be done.*

- WHEN:** Snow has covered the street.
- WHAT:** If you park your car on an Designated Snow Route, **MOVE YOUR VEHICLE.** Cars left on emergency routes will be ticketed and towed.
- WHERE:** If you normally park on a Designated Snow Route **MOVE YOUR VEHICLE** to:
- 1)Your Driveway
  - 2)A nearby street which is not a designated snow route.
  - 3)An alternative snow storm parking area as indicated on the map. (Please be aware that on weekdays the NBPA and Rutgers parking facilities require your car be removed by 8:00am unless otherwise indicated.)
- HOW LONG:** Your vehicle must stay off the street until the snow ends and the street is completely plowed. This **MAY** mean keeping your car removed until the next day.
- WHAT ELSE:** After the street has been cleared, park your car as normal, which **MAY** require shoveling. Do not push excess snow back into the street but rather onto lawns & other non-travel areas.

# DESIGNATED SNOW ROUTES

As per the City of New Brunswick Ordinance 12-10.01, parking is prohibited on certain streets in the event of snow. Whenever snow has fallen and the accumulation of snow covers the roadway, no vehicle shall be parked on the following **DESIGNATED SNOW ROUTE** streets.

Albany Street	Jersey Avenue
Bayard Street	Joyce Kilmer Avenue
Church Street	Kirkpatrick Street
College Avenue	Livingston Avenue
Commercial Avenue	Louis Street
Courtland Street	Morris Street
Easton Avenue	Neilson Street
Elm Row	New Street
French Street	Paterson Street
George Street	Sandford Street
Georges Road	Scott Street
Hamilton Street	Somerset Street
Handy Street	Suydam Street
Huntington Street	Wall Street

Signs stating "**NO PARKING WHEN ROAD IS SNOW COVERED**" are posted on all affected streets. This restriction shall remain in effect after the snow has ceased until the streets have been plowed sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.
